A way of leading and serving that is open, fair, and built to last.

We seek to bring people together, never to divide. This is an amanah we all share.

To every brother who has given their time to this masjid — past and present — **we say thank you.**

Why we have gathered today

We are not here to look back. We are here to look forward — together.

A vision to share

How our masjid could serve every family — especially the young.

A better way to lead

Clear roles, real oversight, and nothing done behind closed doors.

An invitation

Nothing is decided. This is yours to shape, with us.

Imagine our masjid as a living hub

More than a place we pray and leave — a heart for the whole community.

Youth programmes

Spaces where our young people belong and thrive.

Clubs for children

Even a cricket club — keeping our kids close to the masjid.

Welfare for families

Real support for those in need, with dignity.

Learning that excels

A madrasa our children love and are proud of.

Events all year

Ramadan, Eid and gatherings that bring us together.

A door always open

Anyone who wants to help, for the sake of Allah, is welcome.

For our children, especially

Our children are the amanah within the amanah.

If they do not find belonging in the masjid, they will find it elsewhere. A thriving masjid gives the next generation a reason to stay close — to their faith, their community, and each other.

The Prophet ﷺ said: “The best of you are those who learn the Qur'an and teach it.” — Sahih al-Bukhari

But a vision needs a vehicle

Good intentions are not enough. Good intentions need good structure.

Programmes fade when they rest on one person's goodwill. They last when the way we are organised protects them — with clear roles, real oversight, and openness built in. That is what the rest of this presentation is about.

First, understand what this is

Masjid Amanah is a model — a way of working. Not a piece of software.



The heart of it is one idea: a **clear separation between the Officers of the Charity and the Officers of the Masjid.**

This is the thing we adopt.

The model is the principle. The app simply makes the model easy to follow — and hard to ignore. It serves the model; it is never the point of it.

Adopt the model first. The system follows.

The core idea: two teams, one masjid

A clear line of separation — so each can do its job well.

The Compliance Team

Makes sure the rules are followed.

- Guards the constitution
- Oversees finances and records
- Ensures meetings and elections are proper
- Answerable to the law & Charity Commission

The Operations Team

Runs everything, day to day.

- Madrasa, youth and welfare
- Events, facilities and funerals
- Serving the community directly
- Answerable to the community & to Allah (SWT)

Think of a cricket match

Everyone already understands this — and it explains the whole idea.

The umpires

On-field umpire · TV umpire · third umpire

They don't bat or bowl. They make sure the game is played fairly and by the rules.

= The Compliance Team

The players & captains

Captains lead · players play their part

They play the game. As many players as the team needs — each in the role they're best at.

= The Operations Team

But we are not a sports team

This is an amanah — not a game. So the real question is about people.

If you were building an extension on your home, you'd want the best builder.
If you were hiring for your business, you'd want the best person for the job.

So why would we accept anything less for the house of Allah?

Right people, right job. A role here is an amanah — a trust to be carried — never a prize to be won. So we set aside whatever we might want for ourselves, and ask only one question: who will serve the masjid best, for the sake of Allah (SWT)?

Two kinds of service, in our own words

Officers of the Charity

Chairman · Treasurer · Secretary

They serve the institution. Their arena is the boardroom, the accounts and the governance record. Largely unseen by the worshipper — but answerable to the law.

Officers of the Masjid

The Amir · Service Council Leads

They serve the community. Their arena is the prayer hall, the khutbah, the madrasa and the welfare of the people. They are the visible face of the masjid.

Both serve the institution. Both serve the community. Both serve Allah (SWT).

The work, organised into service councils

Ten areas of service for this first phase — each led by someone who knows it best. Anyone willing to help is welcome.

Each council has a Lead — and as many helpers as come forward, for the sake of Allah (SWT). No one is turned away.

No one rules forever

Leadership is a duty, not a throne.

The Amir is chosen by the Leads

Not self-appointed. The service council leads elect the Amir from among themselves.

Terms are limited

The Amir serves, then must step aside and let another lead. Leadership rotates.

The Friday platform rotates too

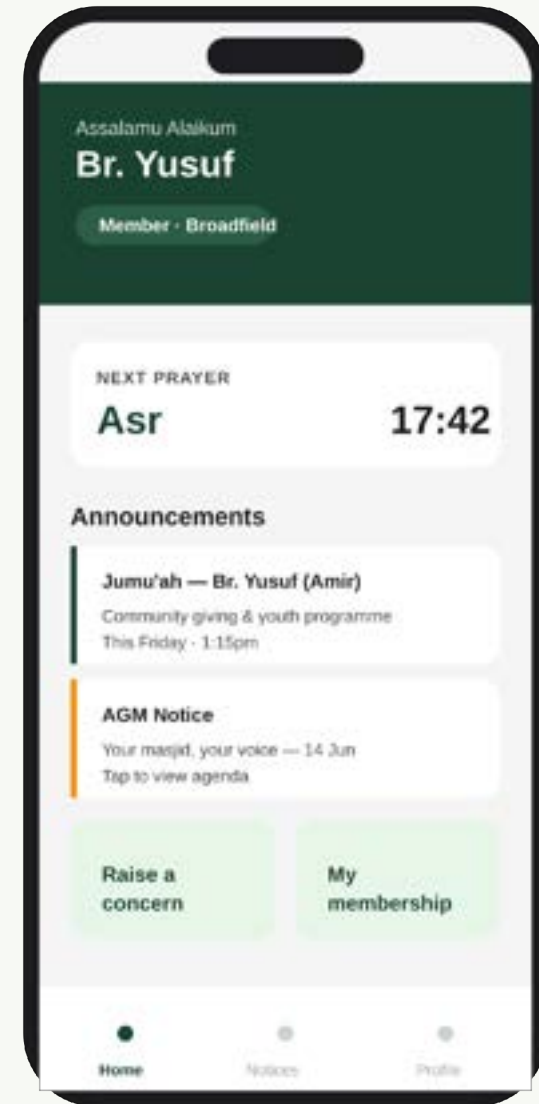
Who speaks to the community is shared — never controlled by one voice.

Built on trust you can see

The model made easy — not the model itself. The platform makes good governance visible: recorded, open, and in your hand.

- Notices and decisions, visible to members
- A record of what was decided, and when
- Raise a concern — including safeguarding — easily
- Members consulted, not just informed

And if the app isn't ready? It still works. The compliance team runs the very same checks by hand. **You are backing a way of working — not betting on an app.**



A glimpse of what we're designing — early concept

How we get there — lawfully

This is not a takeover. Every step belongs to the members.



Substantive change to a charity's governance is made by its members — properly, openly, on the record.

We are not asking you to
elect us.

**We are asking you to elect a
process.**

A way of working that outlasts any one person — fair, open, and built for the whole community.

What we ask of you

Nothing here is decided. This belongs to you.

Think on it

Sit with this vision. Ask questions. Bring your own ideas.

Talk to us

Come to us, challenge us, help us shape it. Your voice matters.

Stand with us

When the time comes, back a better way of serving our masjid.

Let us come together — and forget the labels.
